ETHOS**Catholic Schools' Week**

We will once again, this year, be celebrating Catholic Schools' week from 6 - 10 June. During this time we will attempt to show, in different ways, that we are proud of our Catholic school and traditions. We will take time to celebrate who we are and what we do.

Every school is a place of learning, but what makes schools like ours different is that we are also a faith based school. We are a school where faith is part of everything that we do, how we learn, how we play, how we treat each other, the kind of people we are. The two things are connected and this is what makes us the kind of school we are.

We learn to recognise and use the talents and gifts that God has given us so that we can be the best that we can be.

We learn how to serve in many different ways: helping on the playground, cleaning up in the classroom, welcoming people who are visitors or new to our school, caring for each other and for the greater community.

This year the theme for Catholic Schools' Week is: ***CATHOLIC SCHOOLS: CHALLENGED TO PROCLAIM GOD'S MERCY.***

It is hoped that this theme will help contextualize the Jubilee Year of Mercy proclaimed by Pope Francis. Pope Francis wants this to be the year when we remember that our God is a God of mercy, a God of love and compassion, a God who forgives all and always forgives. God's mercy is for everyone; no one is excluded. This year we are invited to consider what that means for each one of us as a member of God's family.

We know that Jesus is the face of God's mercy. It is he who allows us to see how merciful the Father is. When we see how Jesus is with people whom others condemn and reject, we begin to glimpse the mercy of God.

When we see the way that Jesus heals, the way he forgives, the way he loves, we see the mercy of God. We are called to be like Jesus, so we too must try to be the face of God's mercy to those whom we meet.



During this Catholic Schools Week, we will explore with the children how they can be the face of God's mercy in our classrooms, the playground, our school, our families and our community. Each day has a specific theme that, we hope, will help the children to come to understand how they can proclaim God's mercy every day.

The daily themes are as follows:

Monday: I am the face of God's mercy when I am kind and compassionate

Tuesday: I am the face of God's mercy when I forgive and reconcile

Wednesday: Grandparents are the face of God's mercy

Thursday: I am the face of God's mercy when I am fair and just

Friday: I am the face of God's mercy when I live like Jesus

OUTREACH PROGRAMME

Thank you to all our Veritas Families who continue to support our various outreach projects.



- **St Vincent de Paul's Society, Springs Catholic Church:** Many children brought offerings of food to our Ascension Day Mass. These items of food will be distributed, by the Catholic Church, to poor families in the community.
- **Kwasa Primary School:** We continue to ask our learners to bring an extra sandwich, fruit, juice, etc. to school on Fridays for the children at the Kwasa Primary School situated in the informal settlement of Daggafontein. Kwasa is an outreach project run by the St. Peter & St Paul Anglican Church.

As we celebrate the 'Year of Mercy' this year we have decided that each Grade will be afforded the opportunity to bring their offering for Kwasa up during our school assemblies on Fridays. Please take note, however, that our valued regular contributors may also take their offering up during these assemblies. It is not solely for the particular scheduled Grade. Teachers will remind their classes of when it is their Friday.

A letter has already been distributed informing families of the following two outreach initiatives:

- **'Tekkie Tax' Day, on Friday 27 May 2016.** The Tekkie Tax packet includes 2 Tekkie Tags + 2 shoelaces + 1 Sticker for a cost of **R35 per packet**, or learners may buy just the **sticker for R10**. Learners may then wear their stickers and 'tekkies', with **civvies**, to school on Friday, 27 May 2016.
- **Tags and Tops for Wheelchair Charity** . Families are asked to bring the plastic tags that close the bread packets and any plastic bottle tops (cool drink or milk) to school. By collecting these items, which we usually just throw away, we can help to get a wheel chair for someone who is unable to afford to buy one.
- **'Old' Shoes Drive.** Thank you for your donations!

PRE-PREPARATORY NEWS

It is extremely important for parents to guide and support their children. We would like to thank all our dedicated parents who take the time to check and sign homework; who read and follow up on newsletters and messages; who make sure their child is dressed smartly, in the correct uniform; who encourage their child to participate in extra mural activities, etc. Thank you, thank you!!

If you are not in this routine yet, we encourage you to make an effort to be there for your child.

Seven Benefits of Using Routines with Your Children

1. Routine eliminates power struggles

Routines eliminate power struggles because you aren't bossing the child around. This activity (brushing teeth, napping, turning off the TV to come to dinner) is just what we do at this time of day. The parent stops being the bad guy, and nagging is greatly reduced.

2. Routine help children cooperate

Routines help kids cooperate by reducing stress and anxiety for everyone. We all know what comes next, we get fair warning for transitions, and no one feels pushed around, or like parents are being arbitrary.

3. Routine help children learn to take charge of their own activities.

Over time, children learn to brush their teeth, pack their suitcase, etc., without constant reminders. Children love being in charge of themselves. This feeling increases their sense of mastery and competence.

4. Children learn the concept of "looking forward" to things they enjoy...

They may want to go to the playground now, but can learn that we always go to the playground in the afternoon, and can look forward to it then.

5. Regular routines help children get on a schedule

Regular routines help children get on a schedule, so that they fall asleep more easily at night.

6. Routines help parents build in those precious connection moments.

We all know that we need to connect with our children every day, but when our focus is on moving children through the schedule to get them to bed, we miss out on opportunities to connect. If we build little connection rituals into our routine, they become habit.

7. Schedules help parents maintain consistency in expectations.

If everything is a fight, parents end up allowing: more TV, skip brushing teeth for tonight, etc. With a routine, parents are more likely to stick to healthy expectations for everyone in the family, because that's just the way we do things in our household. The result: a family with healthy habits, where everything runs more smoothly!



INTERMEDIATE/SENIOR PHASE NEWS

Academic News

- **Cycle Test Timetables** have been issued but teachers are still waiting for the signed reply slips to be returned by learners
- The Grade 4 – 7 pupils will be writing formal **Examinations** from Wednesday 13 July to Wednesday 20 July. Learners will be issued with the Exam Timetable and 'What to Study' list on the 27th of May. Parents/Guardians are requested to see to it that their children prepare adequately for these exams.
- The weighting of **Continuous Assessment (CASS) against Formal Examinations** is as follows:

GRADE 4	-	75% CASS	: 25% EXAM
GRADE 5	-	60% CASS	: 40% EXAM
GRADE 6	-	50% CASS	: 50% EXAM
GRADE 7	-	40% CASS	: 60% EXAM
- In order to maintain a high academic standard at Veritas College we will continue to view 50% as the required percentage, for all subjects, in order to pass a Grade.



In certain circumstances, and after consultation with the Head of Preparatory and Educational Psychologist, specific exceptions may be made in the case of certain pupils.

NB! All Parents please take note:

- From Wednesday, 13 July Inter/Sen learners will be writing two exams per day. In order to afford learners the opportunity to prepare adequately for these examinations, **school will close at 12:00 from Tuesday, 12 July, up to and including, Wednesday, 20 July 2016.**
- Many Senior Phase pupils have younger brothers and sisters in the Foundation and Pre-Primary Phases of the school, and therefore, during this assessment period (Tuesday, 12 July, up to and including, Wednesday, 20 July 2016.), school will close at 12:00 for ALL children from the Pre-Primary (Grade 000) through to Grade 7. Waiting classes will be available until 13:00 for pupils who cannot be fetched at 12:00

The **After-School Care** will continue to function as normal during this time.

- **Parental Work Control** – On Friday, 27 May the learners, from Grades 4 – 7, will bring home all their exercise books for their parents to view and comment on. Control forms will be pasted into all books. In order for parents to be aware of their child’s progress, it is important for parents to monitor their child’s work from time to time and so we ask that these Parental Control Forms be signed and comments made if necessary.
- We are concerned about the low number of Grade 4-7 children who are reading books and the need for this so that they become proficient in English with an understanding and ability to comprehend what is being asked in examinations and test questions. Very few make use of the Media Centre to withdraw books either fiction or non-fiction. We get ‘Hooked on Books’ to stimulate the interests of the children in reading as we feel this is so important.
- Grade 6 and 7 will attend a **Science Demonstration** on Friday 20th May at the Senior School.
- Grade 6 and 7 also attended a **baking day** at the Senior School and thoroughly enjoyed the experience. They were also able to view the Hall for the Matric Farewell.

As the term has just begun, we again emphasize that children must approach all work with a positive attitude and work ethic so as to achieve to the best of their ability.

LEARNER SUPPORT

Learner Support Classes

Our Grade 4- Grade 7 Learner Support Classes have started and learners who are required to attend these classes received letters which parents needed to sign and return to school. This year we have tried to schedule the classes so as to best accommodate other co-curricular activities and we trust that our learners will make a concerted effort to attend. We have also started registering our Learning Support

pupils onto an interactive online learning platform which will provide the opportunity for all pupils to learn specific skills at their own pace. Family members will be able to access this platform and will be able to take a look at the activities being done during these classes. There already seems to be a sense of excitement from our learners and we eagerly look forward to the increased rolling out of this project throughout the term.

School Counselling Services

Many of our teaching staff have been trained in either chaplaincy or lay counselling services. Over the weekends of the 7th and 14th of May a few more of our pre-preparatory and foundation phase teachers attended a comprehensive workshop in play therapy. Families are reminded that the first point of call for any potential counselling services required through the school will be with each child's class teacher. Remember that a child's growth is holistic and that any difficulties experienced in the home environment often have a significant impact on their learning potential in the classroom. It is always a good idea to keep the communication channels open between the home and the school. For more severe trauma, the class teacher may be able to arrange counselling for the pupil through the School Educational Psychologist but this would usually be limited to the urgency of the need and the time available. For pupils requiring a more specialised service or who would benefit from medium to long-term counselling, referral will be made to outside providers.

Studying For Examinations

With examination season being just around the corner for our Grade 4-7 learners, the Grade 4's will again be given a brief workshop on good study habits as well as techniques to maximise their learning potential. Learners making use of the Learner Support Classes will also be exposed to the different *styles* of learning, (and which style suits them best), through interactive activities. However we encourage families to remind their children of the following: **"Proper preparation prevents poor performance."** Start the revision process well before the time to help prevent exam anxiety.






